Weather




The weather in Morelia is very unpredictable. Although it may be clear and sunny at dawn, sometimes it clouds and rains during the day, and then it is clear again. However, these last days of spring have been very hot in Morelia. It is recommended to bring some cool clothes but also a coat in case it rains or the temperature drops.

Safety Information:

- Carry your credit and/or debit cards in a safe place and carry only as much cash as necessary.
- Change your money only in hotels, banks or authorized money exchange offices.
- Never give money or documents to people who approach you on the street and claim to be police, security or government agents. Only police agents of the National Police (uniformed police) can demand your documents, and they must be properly identified by badges or credentials.
- Do not lose sight of your personal belongings in public places.
- Never board unknown or unauthorized vehicles. Be careful with strangers, especially in bars and restaurants.
- Try not to walk in secluded, poorly lit places and vacant lots such as paddocks, lots or alleys, especially late at night.
- Avoid wearing jewelry or accessories that attract attention. Be cautious with your cell phones, video and photographic cameras.
- Use the safety deposit boxes in your hotel room if there are any.

Voltage:

In Mexico the standard voltage is 110 V and the frequency is 60 Hz. (It is recommended to bring travel power adapted if needed).




Health Insurance

Workshop in the Santa Fe de la Laguna Community

The community of Santa Fe de la Laguna is that of the Indigenous Peoples Purépecha, whose population is around 5,000 inhabitants.

<u>Santa Fe de la Laguna</u> Community is a town within the municipality of Quiroga. It is approximately 45 km from Morelia, 1 hour and 15 minutes by bus.



Transportation costs

The organizers will reimburse transportation costs from your residence - airport - hotel and from the hotel - airport - residence. Please keep copies of payment receipts. If receipts are not available, please inform us of the cost of transportation.

Dinners

With the exception of the welcome dinner on June 10 in Morelia, participants are free to choose their preferred place for dinner.

Per Diem

The organizers will provide 24 Canadian dollars per lunch and 42 Canadian dollars per meals that are not provided during the travel and workshop days.

Requirements to enter Mexico

Mexico does not currently require COVID vaccination, PCR testing or mandatory quarantine.

Canadian Citizens

Canadian nationals and permanent residents of Canada do not require a visa to enter Mexico. Canadian nationals must present a valid passport to prove their nationality. **Mexican authorities do not require a minimum period of validity of passports**; nevertheless, this document must be valid at the time of entry and during the period you wish to be in Mexico.

Permanent residents of Canada must present their Permanent Resident Card and one of the following documents: valid Passport or Refugee Travel Document.

Electronic Multiple Migratory Form for Air Travel (FMME Aérea) which facilitates and expedites the registration of your entry to Mexico.
